It was noted that this is negatively affecting the community and its children. His concerns included: purpose, since we intend to return to inperson learning next year, invasion of privacy, mistrust in the school environment, policy for rights and responsibilities for all parties involved with regard to FERPA, appropriate use of funding, lack of transparency and communication with staff, and lack of training.

Mr. Dearden clarified funding issues, Hunter White spoke positively on his experience with the audio enhancement system, and Mr. Parks spoke on the system's academic advantages.
